Which retailers are staying open? (From the BBC website)

Any retailer selling "essential" goods and services may stay open to the public as long as they follow coronavirus guidelines and make their premises Covid-secure. Those on the list include:

- Food shops, supermarkets, garden centres, hardware stores, building merchants and offlicences
- Petrol Stations, car repair and MOT services, bicycle shops, and taxi and vehicle hire businesses
- Banks, building societies, post offices, loan providers and money transfer businesses
- Medical services such as dentists, opticians and pharmacies
- Vets and pet shops
- Agricultural supplies shops
- Other High Street businesses staying open include storage facilities, funeral directors, launderettes, dry cleaners and car parks
- Public toilets and motorway service stations.

A quick check on what is open in Headington tallies with the stated policy. Our observations suggest that in addition to the afore-mentioned, estate agents are open, as are most cafés -with take-away service only. As the Headington Fair Trade shop is not classed as essential, it closed as of 5th November. Until it is allowed to re-open, it is working on setting up a click and collect service. This will enable customers to order and pay for a select range of items from the website. These can then be collected from the rear of the shop at a pre-arranged time. Message from Oxfordshire Libraries: In line with government guidance, all libraries will remain closed from Thursday November 5. Loans will be extended to January 2021 and may be extended further.
